#### Faith Fact: Easter is More than a Day

This time of year, as people prep for the bunny and baskets of Easter Sunday, it is important to remember that for Catholics, Easter is not merely one day but an entire season. Eastertide or the Easter season stretches for fifty day from Easter Sunday to Pentecost (when the Holy Spirit descends upon the apostles). This Easter season is marked by the joyful celebration of Christ's resurrection and the Church as witness to the resurrection. Notice that the Sunday readings change during this season; the Old Testament reading is replaced by stories of the earliest disciples evangelizing in the Acts of the Apostles. In the car on the way home from Mass this Sunday, talk about the reading from Acts and how we are still called to witness to the resurrection more than two thousand years later!

The DANGER at home. Time to clean out **vour medicine** cabinet!



Did you know that the abuse of prescription drugs is the fastest-growing drug problem in the United States? It is the second leading cause of injury and death among 25- to 64vear-olds.

Adults aren't the only victims. Older children and teens may be tempted to experiment with easily available medications, causing harm to themselves or their friends. Nationally, one in five teens report abusing prescription drugs that were not prescribed to them.

Unused medications can also fall into the hands of small children and cause accidental poisoning. More than one million children under the age of five are treated each year in the United States for poisoning caused by household chemicals and medications.

When over-the-counter or prescription medications are no longer needed, they should be removed from the home.

Be a part of the solution by participating in National Prescription Drug Take Back Day on Sat., April 29, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. There are three locations across the county.

There are items Drug Take Back programs cannot accept. Please familiarize yourself with the list and dispose of those items appropriately.

Drug Take-Back Programs cannot accept the following items: Needles and other Sharps, Mercury (thermometers), Oxygen containers, Chemotherapy drugs or radioactive substances, Pressurized canisters, and Illicit drugs.
